

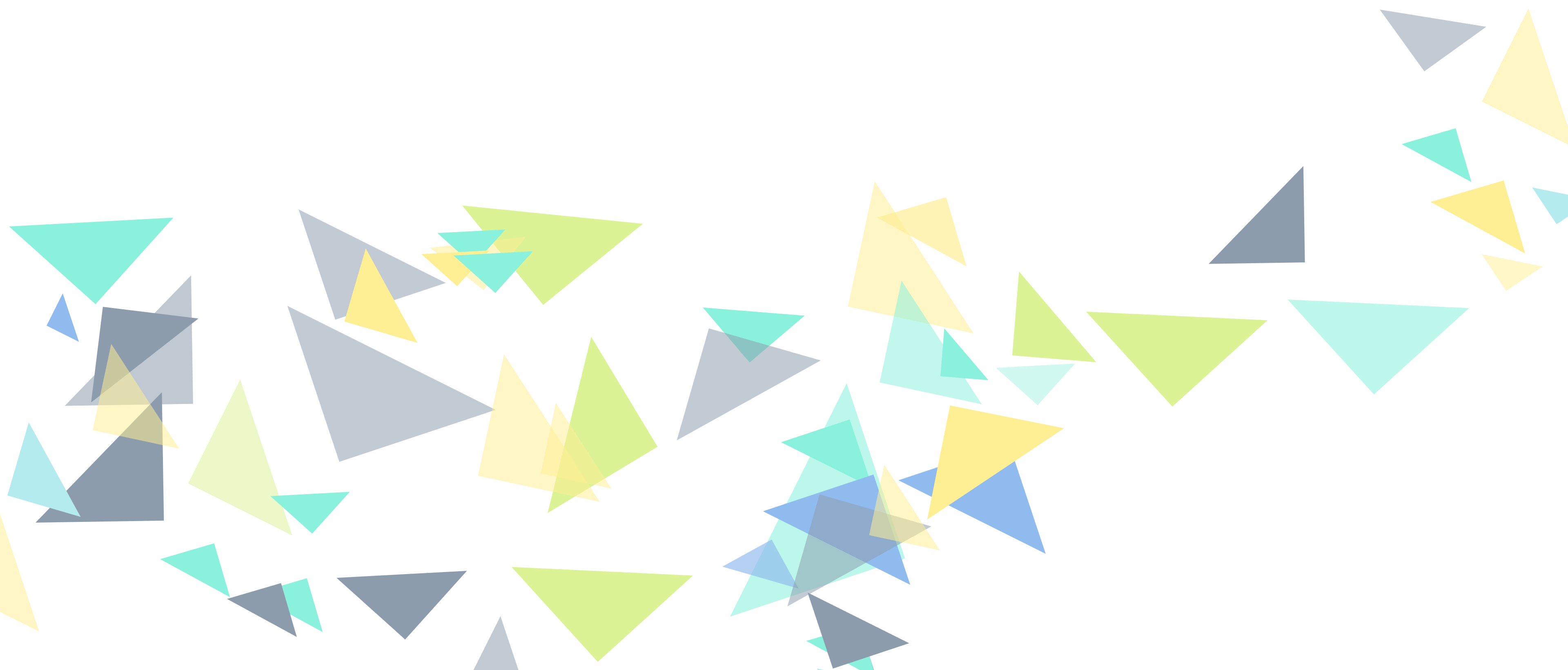

What is the Well-being of Future Generations Act?



- The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 requires public bodies - such as local authorities, health boards and organisations like the Arts and Sports Councils of Wales - to put long-term sustainability at the forefront of their thinking, and work with each other along with other relevant organisations (such as third sector groups) and the public to prevent and tackle problems.
- Public bodies need to make sure that when making their decisions they take into account the impact they could have on people living their lives in Wales now and in the future.
- The Act also forms Public Service Boards most of these work on a local authority footprint, although several are working together. The purpose of Public Services Boards (PSBs) is to improve the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being in its local area by strengthening joint working across all public services in Wales.

Well-being Objectives

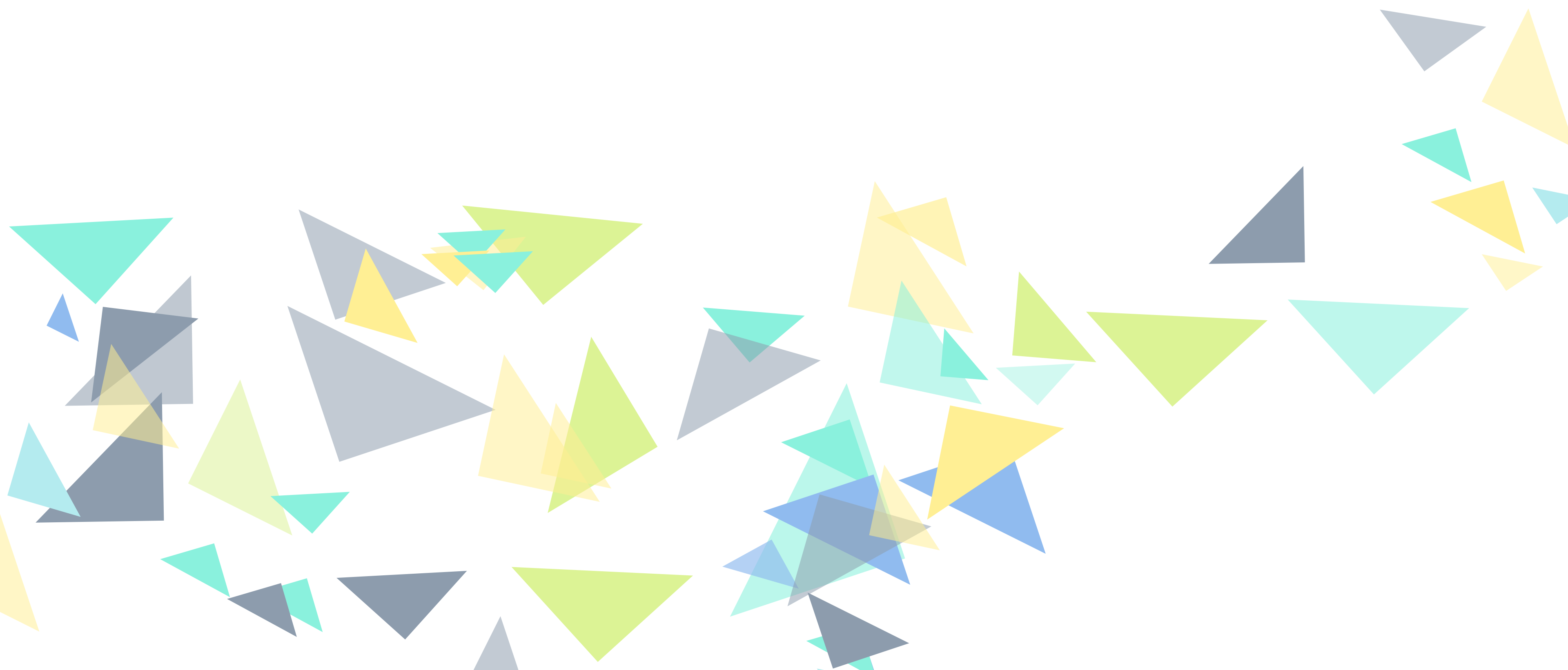
- Public bodies must set objectives on how they maximise their contributions to the 7 well-being goals.
- Public bodies must then take action to make sure they meet the objectives they set.
- Each year public bodies must publish an annual report showing the progress they have made in meeting their objectives.
- The Future Generations Commissioner for Wales provides advice and assistance to public bodies
- The Future Generations Commissioner for Wales monitors and assesses their progress.

What is the Future Generations Report?



- The Future Generations Commissioner for Wales must publish, a year before an Assembly election, a report containing the Commissioner's assessment of the improvements public bodies should make to achieve the well-being goals.
- The Commissioner must report about the period between 2017 and 2020 and she must consult with specific stakeholders under the law.
- The report is also timed to influence the Welsh Assembly Elections in 2021.

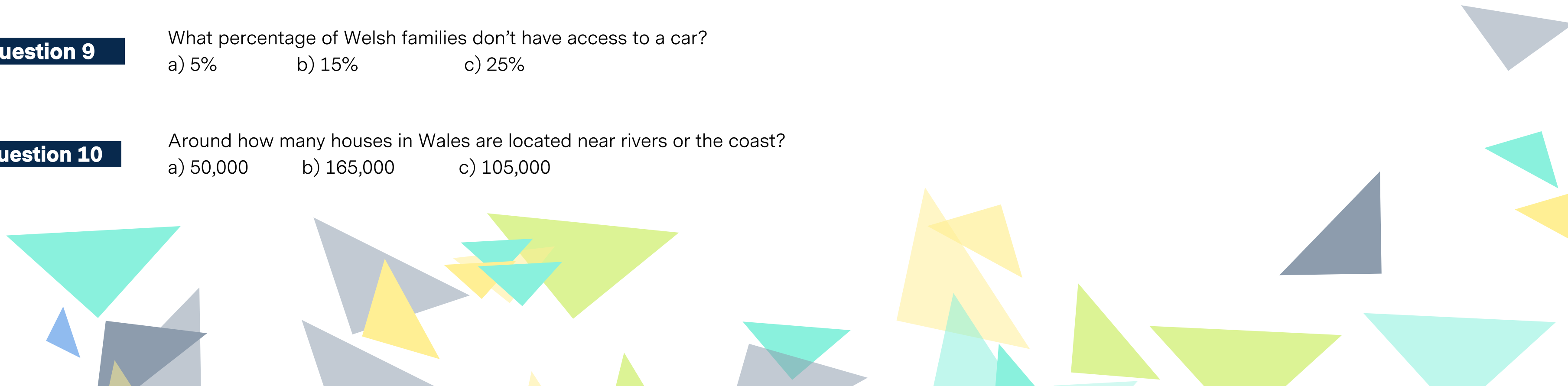
